<i>Youth Activities and Support Groups</i>		
Community Action Partnership Vince Harper 707-544-6911 x1051	Project Safe \$34,957	Services in south, southwest, and northwest Santa Rosa to provide youth development services, including recreation, leadership, community engagement, academic support, and career activities.
Double Punches Boxing Richard and Maria Lopez 707-586-2448	Youth Character and Fitness \$20,680	Outreach to “at-risk” youth to intervene in the cycle of gang recruitment with focused activities and discipline-enhancing fitness development.
Martial Arts Youth Institute Robin Guasco 707-843-9007	Martial Arts for Youth \$44,650	Outreach program where youth learn life skills through the martial arts. They train mind and body together as one to become empowered to make positive choices. Leadership and job skills are also taught with the teens.
Roseland Charter School Erica Bosque 707-321-5955	Roseland University Prep After School Program \$42,926	An after school program for youth at-risk of school failure, focusing on health promotion services, enrichment and fitness, homework assistance, and tutoring.
United Against Sexual Assault Christine Castillo 707-545-7270 x21	Youth Empowerment \$14,099	A compendium of prevention education programs geared towards reducing the vulnerability of youth to sexual, physical, and emotional assault.

Community Action Partnership Vince Harper 707-544-6911 x1051	Padres Unidos \$24,510	Services to parents of youth who have been classified as “out of control” youth by law enforcement or school personnel.
<i>Job Readiness Training/Placement</i>		
Hope Works Santa Rosa Daryl Reese 707-528-7240	Employment \$52,454	A faith-based job development organization working with former gang-affiliated and adjudicated youth, those with criminal records and those who have incomplete high school education, helping to disassociate from gangs, find gainful employment and experience a renewed life.
Social Advocates for Youth Tom Bieri 707-544-3299	Youth Employment Center \$59,370	Year-round youth employment services to youth who are either active in gangs or at high risk of gang involvement.
<i>Gang Mediation and Intervention Services</i>		
California Youth Outreach Steve Velasquez 707-228-3200	Gang Mediation and Intervention Services \$125,391	Will provide city-wide outreach to gang-involved youth between the ages of 15 – 25 to intervene and provide assistance to leave the gang lifestyle and make direct referrals to appropriate services. Outreach efforts will include coordination with local law enforcement and probation.
